Theology of the Body for Teens Study Group - Report

"It changed my life." was one student's response at the conclusion to the *Theology of the Body for Teens* study group at Fr. Leo J. Austin High School in Durham Region. Others said....

GSML Ministry just completed a 12 week program using the ToB for Teens. Working with approximately 100 teens, it was an exciting time, and we enjoyed and learned so much from these young people.

The Religion Department made us feel very welcome, and we came to know that the school was blessed by many teachers who truly care for their students' welfare and well-being. The students themselves participated actively and had many penetrating questions.

The "ice breaker" activity set the pace for the daily instruction and the students looked forward to them each time. Every activity taught a lesson, for example - God has a message for the Christian, but it could not be heard amid the noise of the modern age. One student (God), stood at one end of the room passing a message to another student (the Christian) in a normal voice. The rest of the students stood between them talking and singing in normal voices. The lesson was brought home so effectively that students realized the original assurance that he or she would be able to hear God, was replaced by dismay and surprise when they didn't hear Him over the daily noise and clamour in the room. It was good fun.

Each of the 12 sessions started with a Bible reading, followed by a prayer. The lesson was built upon the Bible reading, as we have to first listen to God then respond. After a short review of the previous week, we moved on to the Story Starter, a true story that was often moving. One brought tears to my eyes each time it was read (Session 8). The story was about a soldier, Dave, who had half his face blown away and was anxiously awaiting his fiancée's hospital visit. Moments before she arrived, he witnessed the rejection of his roommate's wife as she declared, "I could never walk down the street with you again-" (He had been burnt from head to toe), and Dave was fearful he would be rejected also. But-his fiancée looked into his one good eye, then bent down and kissed him. "Dave began to experience love in a way he never imagined..."

Each week we also listened to a 20 to 25 minute DVD talk with Jason & Crystalina Evert and Brian Butler who shared many experiences of their own lives, as well as

insightful teaching on purity, chastity, dating and other Theology of the Body topics.

One topic the students found very interesting was on Dating with Purpose and Purity (Session 11).

Let the students speak for themselves (a summary of their comments)

- "I am grateful for this program because I now have a better grasp on my sexual life and it has changed my views on sex. I now understand the importance of treating your partner right and how to live in a pure way."
- "I think theology of the body is great. It makes sense by using language and examples that we understand."
- "Theology of the body was a good experience as it taught us about real issues affecting our lives today."
- "Was a great experience that taught me more about God and His relationship with me."
- "I enjoyed all of the different activities that the group had us do and I had learned a great deal from them. I also enjoyed the videos they had shown us."
- "I now understand what the purpose of human sexuality is. It has taught me how to respect myself and other people."
- "I learned a lot including how to date with a purpose."
- "Every single week I learned something new about what Jesus expects from me as a human being."
- "I know now what a healthy relationship should feel like and how to live in a proper Christian way."
- "Since Theology of the Body I have realized that following in Jesus' footsteps can really change your life. It has helped me realize and think about my relationship with God and how I need to keep in touch with God to strengthen our relationship through prayer."
- "Theology of the Body has taught me a lot about relationships and how to allow God into my life. Before theology of the body I wasn't fully sure how to let God into my life. Thank you so much for teaching me how to open up to God."

Other Thoughts

"The evil of our times consists in the first place in a kind of degradation, indeed in

a pulverization, of the fundamental uniqueness of each human person." Blessed John Paul II summed up in these few words the way adults perceive teenagers in today's society. In general we view them as being selfish, uncaring, irresponsible and perhaps even dangerous. We, of course, will automatically deny that we fall into that category as adults, but if we were honest with ourselves, we would admit that it is closer to what we think, as not. How can it be otherwise. As Christopher West asserts, we are all "so darned interested" in sex because the media puts it front and center everywhere, in advertizing, in news and in photography. This is the same media that tells teens their peers are "doing it", are into drugs, and yes the real message is that each person is the same, and not fundamentally unique. They rarely show the good side of teens, but seem to stress the negative side, and the lack of self-determination many youths possess.

Theology of The Body for Teens was a recent revelation for me. The teens' responses to our efforts, as shown elsewhere in this newsletter, left us in no doubt that these youth are looking for answers. It showed me that they do not really believe the media hype, but are struggling with efforts to find a better alternative. The cause for this struggle can only be placed at our door. As adults, we have failed to help them deal with the horrendous burden of growing up in today's immoral society. Workshops like Theology of The Body for Teens, and others our Ministry offers, can help, but, as parents and adults, we have to start supporting and trusting teens to do the right thing. One of the most encouraging comments was that the GSML team was non-judgmental. We were there to help, not criticize. As parents and adults, one of the best ways for us to encourage youth to change is summed up in another quotation from Blessed John Paul II "Do not forget that true love sets no conditions; it does not calculate or complain, but simply loves."

We should all adopt that as one of our New Year resolutions.

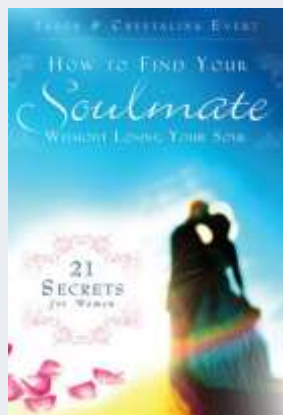

Points to Ponder

While addressing the Reichstag in Berlin Germany on a recent apostolic journey, Pope Benedict XVI spoke about the importance of respecting the ecology of man.

In this address the Holy Father noted that man (generic of the human race) is much more than just a being with free will, man is also nature. It is only when we accept and orient ourselves based on this nature that we can find true happiness.

Pope Benedict used this opportunity to speak to the German people about laws, and the importance of ensuring laws are oriented towards the true nature of man.

Ensuring our laws are oriented towards nature is important; but also, equally important is ensuring a true moral education. This moral education must be more than just a secular education about the ABC's and 1-2-3's of math, science and literature. This education, as the Holy Father points out in his address (released December 16, 2011) on the occasion of the World Day of Peace, must start with the family, the "first school" for young people. During this address the Holy Father also spoke of the need to ensure that education does not "detach the concept of justice from its transcendent roots".

With the family as the first school, this makes parents the first teachers. So what can parents do to ensure they are providing a moral education that respects the true ecology of man? This is a challenge that the Canadian Catholic bishops are looking to address with the release of a catechism that will be based on Blessed John Paul II's "Theology of the Body". The "Theology of the Body" contains, at its core, a respect for human life and sexual / married love, which is of fundamental importance to ensuring man is properly oriented towards nature, with a true moral education. With many of our laws already contrary to the true ecology of man (eg. a woman's right to abortion, homosexual marriage) it is especially important that today's young people are educated on God's plan for life and love. If parents do not take this challenge seriously, children will be educated by secular sources,

including the media, which already teach that a homosexual marriage is legitimate. With the release of the Canadian Catholic Bishop's catechism for families, as well as existing material on "Theology of the Body", there are a number of resources available for parents including CDs / DVDs, etc., that can be ordered online.

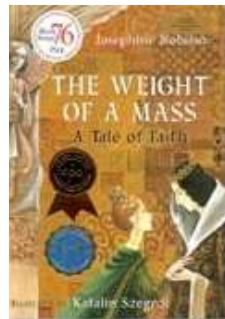

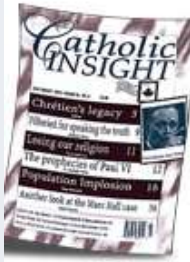

The Billings Ovulation Method teaches a woman to interpret her natural signs of fertility through all her changing life stages from puberty to menopause. It is not the Rhythm method nor the Calendar method. It does not involve temperature taking. The Billings Ovulation Method is easy to learn and is highly successful when used by a couple to achieve or avoid a pregnancy. This method of natural family planning engenders co-operation and respect between the woman and man. It develops love and concern for each other and for the child, thus enriching their relationship.

Once learned, the method can be applied to all variations throughout a woman's reproductive life:

- regular cycles

- irregular cycles
- anovular cycles
- effects of stress
- low fertility
- after childbirth or miscarriage
- while breastfeeding and weaning
- approaching menopause
