

Man's Awareness Of Being A Person Pope John Paul II

Summary of the Sixth Audience by Tom Kennedy

In the previous audience, the Pope told us about man's original solitude both as the male human, and as a species. In this audience, he told us that Geneses portrays man as a person with all the qualities that describe him, or make up his being.. God gave man the order not to touch the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. This gave man the features of self-determination and choice. He gave us free will. This, by itself, gives man qualities that belong only to him.

Original solitude includes self –consciousness and self-determination, which give man an awareness of who and what he is, and the ability to make his own decisions. The fact that man is “alone” allows him to understand his role within the realm of his existence, and is the first meaning of original solitude. This allows us

unique, exclusive and unrepeatable relationship with God himself"

to understand the words "I will make him a helper", and the second meaning of original solitude.

We are told that man is made in the image of God, and later that he is shown to be a "subject of the covenant". This means that he was created with the dignity and function of being a person, and that he was created with the dignity and function of being "a partner of the Absolute". In other words not only was he human, but he was created in a covenant or holy, binding agreement and partnership with God. He is allowed by both of these states to know and choose between good and evil. Through his humanity then, he is a partner with God, and he has a unique, never to be repeated relationship with God Himself.

Man is of the visible world. A body among bodies". Through the body, he knows he is alone.

The Yahwist text of the bible tells us that "there was no one to till the land" which can be read in context with the Elohist text "Fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion...." This refers to man's work of tilling the earth. To have "dominion" means that he alone in all of creation can dominate it because he is alone, has that capability, and was told he could change it to meet his own needs "irrigate the whole land". We can say then, that this activity belongs only to man, and is a further meaning of original solitude.



John Paul II International Film Festival - 2012

- **Restless Heart**

RESTLESS HEART uses a historic backdrop to tell the true story of Augustine of Hippo -- one of the Catholic Church's most beloved and well-known Saints.

- **If Only We Had Listened**

Follow Immaculee Ilibagiza, a genocide survivor, as she returns to Rwanda, uncovering the secrets of Kibeho, where a prophecy took place, while reconciling with her painful past. Buried beneath the bones of a million victims, a story of faith and hope emerges, and Immaculee reveals that the prophecy of Kibeho is not just a warning for Rwanda, but for the entire world

- **The Fighter's Ballad**

MATURE LANGUAGE (17+ ONLY) London...present day. A violent, desperate man breaks into an inner city church. With him, he brings the anxiety and anger of contemporary society. Once inside the church, he faces his greatest opponent...a world weary Priest. The Fighter challenges the Priest, on the fundamental fabric of

life...faith and death, belief and passion. The scene is set, in the fight for truth, redemption and forgiveness.

- **The Greatest Miracle (El Gran Milagro)**

A story of the unseen sense of going and participating in church. It focuses on three characters and their guardians. This is what is understood to happen within a celebration of mass. From confession, to each part of mass such as communion, the offerings and our prayers for those who have gone to heaven or purgatory. Thus having hope and faith will help the stories advance through the explanation of mass.

- **California Solo**

MATURE LANGUAGE (17+ ONLY) A former Britpop rocker who now works on a farm gets caught driving drunk and faces deportation after living in Los Angeles for many years. His efforts to stay in the U.S. force him to confront the past and current demons in his life.

- **The War Of The Vendee**

In 1793, after enduring three and a half years of mounting persecution by the architects of the French Revolution, a small band of peasants and nobles in a section of western France began a Catholic 'counter-revolution' The sacrifices of the Vendean people resulted in countless martyrdoms, but ultimately won the restoration of religious freedom for all of France. This film is suitable for all ages, and features a non-traditional cast made up entirely of children.

- **Rise And Dream**

Rise and Dream, a documentary, is the story of 13 teenagers who live with the challenges of poverty in a volatile region of the Philippines. When they volunteer to learn traditional instruments for a once-in-a-lifetime concert, the pressure mounts. Their perseverance is inspiring, but the triumph of the teens and their families in their everyday lives invites us to a new understanding of people living in poverty.

- **Somewhere West**

While battling with a terminal illness, Ian decides to forgo treatment and head West in search of solitude and a beautiful place to spend his final moments. However, despite his best efforts, Ian becomes the center of a makeshift family of troubled, but kind-hearted characters who help him in the redemptive process of letting go, opening his heart and finally reaching his undetermined destination.

- **7 Days Of Sacrifice**

7 Days of Sacrifice follows three young men throughout the course of a week as they fight to reject the significant pressures and demands of a self-indulgent culture. The men live together in community for seven days and refuse to eat, believing that their diminishing physical strength will be buoyed by a maturing understanding of the purpose of their own lives and human life in general human life and real, authentic friendships

- **For Greater Glory**

A chronicle of the Cristeros War (1926-1929); a war by the people of Mexico against the atheistic Mexican government.



Peter's Points to Ponder

There have been a number media spins on a recent interview with Pope Francis where the topic of abortion was mentioned, including misquoting or paraphrasing the quote to better facilitate the "media sound bite". In

one instance the Pope was quoted as saying that Church has been “too obsessed with homosexuality and abortion”, triggering the belief among some that the Holy Father is opening the way for a change in Church teachings on these very important topics.

To clarify, the Holy Father said “We cannot insist only on issues related to abortion, gay marriage and the use of contraceptive methods. This is not possible. ... But when we speak about these issues, we have to talk about them in a context. The teaching of the church, for that matter, is clear and I am a son of the church, but it is not necessary to talk about these issues all the time.”

The Holy Father’s remarks are very clear that there will be no change in Church teaching. Abortion and gay marriage are grave sins, and the Church (or more specifically the Pope) has no authority to redefine what is sinful.

The Holy Father’s remarks were not meant to suggest that abortion or gay marriage is somehow becoming “acceptable”, taken in the full context of the interview, the Holy Father was focusing on the need to be a welcoming Church, a Church that spreads the Good News of Jesus Christ (The Gospel). As a Church, it is not enough that we wag a finger at those who are sinning. We need to offer them help; we need to assure them that despite their previous wrongs, the Church stands ready to welcome them “home”. Pope Francis is suggesting a new tone of language is required because we can not properly evangelize if all we do is recite the rule book. We need to be more than just the laws and commandments; we need to be a loving Church, a Church that stands ready to forgive. These comments, when taken in full context, reaffirm using a somewhat different language. What the Holy Father has been saying time and time again, God doesn’t tire of forgiving his people; we tire of asking for forgiveness.

While speaking to an audience of Catholic gynecologists just days after this interview was published, the Holy Father said, “Every child that isn’t born, but is unjustly condemned to be aborted, has the face of Jesus Christ, has the face of the Lord” and pointed to , a “throw-away culture” that fails to respect life. The Holy Father went onto implore those in attendance to stick with their convictions and help bring lives into the world rather than take them.

Let us stand ready to forgive those who have made the mistake of an abortion and assure them of Christ’s loving presence. We cannot end abortions without a change in hearts, and reciting rules to hardened hearts will not work. We need to turn the hearts of stone, to hearts that ache for God’s love and God’s forgiveness.


